

Pennsylvania Equine Council Scholarship: Guidelines & Information for Applicants

Eligibility

- Applicants must have a current individual or family membership in the Pennsylvania Equine Council (PEC) as of March 31st.
- Applicants must have been accepted to a college, university, community college, vocational institute or institute of higher learning (*any academic program*)
- Applicants should be active participants in the equine industry and committed to future involvement in the industry.

Application Process

- Applications must be received by **June 1**.
- ***Submission of application by e-mail is acceptable. Mailed applications (including original signed letters of reference) must be mailed to the address included on application page.***
- The completed application must include:
 - Application (three pages) Includes contact information, participation in activities/organizations, and personal statement topic (500words maximum) explaining the influence of equine activities on career goals.
 - Three letters of reference:
 - Letters must include the contact information of the reference person and their written signature (not digital). (Please avoid using references from relatives.)
 - Two from an adult or equine industry professional (Examples: adult leader, PEC member, trainer, 4-H leader, etc.)
 - One from a community leader or educational professional (Examples: teacher, guidance counselor, pastor, coach, etc.)
 - Letter of acceptance from college, university, community college, etc. and/or current year billing statement (must include applicant’s name and institution’s name and address)

Interviews *may* be conducted for top candidates (by phone or in person)

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Selection Criteria

Applicants will be evaluated on: participation in PEC programs/activities, involvement in equine organizations/activities, participation in youth leadership programs, personal statement, application form, reference letters, community service and interview (if conducted). See score sheet for details.

Selection Process

- The PEC Scholarship Committee will be responsible for selecting award recipients.
- Applicants will be scored and ranked according to stated criteria. Highest scoring applicant will be awarded the scholarship.
- Applicants must receive a minimum score of 85 points to be eligible for a scholarship.
- Incomplete applications or applications lacking all requested items will not be eligible for consideration.

Award Amount

- Funding for the scholarship varies from year to year and is contingent upon availability of funds. The amount available will be determined by the PEC Board with a minimum amount of \$500.

Award Presentation

- Award to be presented at a designated PEC event with the scholarship recipient receiving a certificate and congratulatory letter.
- The scholarship check will be presented after the student has submitted his/her semester grades of at least a minimum of a 2.5 GPA and proof of enrollment for the next semester (send an official copy of selected class schedule for the upcoming semester).
- The scholarship check will be made out to the student.

 - One from a community leader
 - *(Examples: teacher, guidance counselor, pastor, coach, etc.)*
-  Submit copy of an official letter of acceptance from college, university, community, college, etc. **and/or** billing statement from current year
-  **Do not** submit the scoring pages; those are for your reference in application completion.

PEC Activities 15 Points _____

(County, regional or state PEC event, PEC booth at Farm Show/Horse Expo, Equine Learning Center, PEC trail activity, PEC annual meeting, etc.)

Equine Activities/Organizations..... 15 Points _____

(4-H, FFA, Pony Club, riding club, breed or discipline association – AQHYA, AJPFA, USEF, USDF, ECTRA etc; Includes events/activities such as horse shows, camps, clinics, trail rides, 3-day events, etc. at local, county, state, regional, national, or international level)

Youth Leadership Programs 20 Points _____

(Club/organization leader, club/organization officer, officer training, camp counselor, leadership conferences, American Youth Horse Council Symposium, etc.)

Community Service 15 Points _____

(Trail maintenance & cleanup, Food Bank collections, etc.)

Personal Statement 20 Points _____

(Concise, well written; includes impact of past involvement with equine industry on career and goals for future involvement in equine industry)

References..... 10 Points

(Two from an adult or equine industry professional {*Examples: adult leader, PEC member, trainer, 4-H leader, etc.*}; one letter from community leader {*Examples: teacher, guidance counselor, pastor, coach, etc.*}, must include the contact information of the reference person and their written signature {not digital})
